Informed consent in clinical trials

INFORMED CONSENT MEANS

- you have been given all the information available about the trial
- you fully understand all the information
- with a full understanding of what you're signing up for, you agreed to participate

Informed consent is a discussion that lasts as long as you are in the trial. You have the right to understand your treatment and your team will provide the information you need.

LEARN ABOUT YOUR CLINICAL TRIAL

- ask questions throughout the trial
- bring materials home to read more or discuss with family
- get resources in your preferred language (if not English) and ask for a medical interpreter
- tell your team if there is ever anything that you don't understand or are uncomfortable with

Remember, you have the right to leave the trial at any time, for any reason.
