- What are side effects of treatments?
- How can I help/support my mom when she loses her hair?
- ➤ Is there anything besides radiation therapy that gets rid of cancer?
- Could you tell us about medicines that could make cancer more of a chronic illness?
- What makes some cancers curable and others not?
- What causes cancer?
- Can some cancers be caused by environmental things?

- Can babies get cancer?
- ➤ Is there a type of cancer called heart cancer?
- Are there types of cancer that can have a lump and then just go away?
- ➤ Is it possible to have a cancer that should start in one part of the body but it starts in another part of the body?
- Does the food you eat affect your chance of getting cancer?
- Can you explain why all tumors are not cancer?
