RISK FACTORS

Your risk for breast cancer is due to a combination of factors. Having a risk factor does not mean you will get the disease, and not all risk factors have the same effect. Talk with your doctor about how to assess your risk.

Those who have inherited mutations to certain genes, such as BRCA1 and BRCA2, are at higher rick
