



What is a Clinical Trial?



A clinical trial is a research study involving people who volunteer. These studies determine if a new treatment is safe and effective (if it works).

"Treatment" can mean:



Clinical Trials: Why They Matter



 All standard treatments today came from trials

Clinical Trial Phases

Clinical trials occur in 4 phases, each with a different purpose asking an important question:

 $\begin{array}{c} 1 \\ \hline \end{array} \longrightarrow \begin{array}{c} 2 \\ \hline \end{array} \longrightarrow \begin{array}{c} 3 \\ \hline \end{array} \longrightarrow \begin{array}{c} 4 \\ \hline \end{array}$

Phase I

First-in-human safety/dosing; small numbers.

15-50 pts

Phase II

Is it **effective** and work against this cancer type?

Approx 100 pts

Phase III

compares to standard treatment; larger, randomized.

Hundreds of pts

(FDA Approval)

Phase IV

treatment is approved and available. Longterm effects are observed.

Thousands of pts

Types of Breast Cancer Trials

Early-Stage

- Neoadjuvant/adjuvant optimization
- De-escalation/escalation
- Survivorship

Metastatic

- New targeted/Biomarker-matched
- Quality-of-life
- Access to novel therapies

Different Types of Trials

- Screening
- Prevention
- Treatment of a disease
- Quality of life studies
- Survivorship



Pros and Cons of Clinical Trials

Potential for better, safer treatment

Increased number of treatment options

Some study sponsors may pay for all or part of your medical care and other expenses during the trial

Closer monitoring by vour cancer care team

Uncertain side effects


Treatment not working as well as expected

If randomized, may not have a choice on which treatment

If blinded, you and possibly your doctor won't know which treatment you're getting

No matter the outcome, participating in a clinical trial allows you to take an active role in your care and can help improve cancer care for others



For DCIS, stage I-III breast cancer, survivors & healthy/high risk



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Common Barriers

- Geography & time (travel, time off work, caregiving)
- Costs & insurance (routine care vs research costs)
- Language barriers/health literacy
- Local trial not available
- Trust, prior experiences and cultural fit
- Eligibility criteria that excludes many patients
- NOT ASKED BY DOCTOR

Overcoming Barriers: Practical Steps

\$	Request	Request financial navigation early (travel/lodging, copay help)
B	Bring	Interpreter/translated materials; bring an advocate
	Discuss	Discuss visit schedules and remote monitoring possibilities
• • • •	Ask about	If excluded, ask about 'expanded access' or future eligibility
?	Ask about	Ask about NCORP/community sites options

What to Expect: Informed Consent & Safety





Plain language explanation of purpose, procedures, risks/benefits, alternatives



You can ask questions; take time; and withdraw at any point



Independent ethical review (IRB) and Safety Monitoring (DSMB) oversight



Adverse events tracked; your well-being remains the priority

Costs & Coverage Basics





Research items (study drug/tests only done for the trial)often covered by sponsor



Routine care (standard tests/visits you'd get anyway) typically billed to insurance/Medicare



Ask the site for a coverage analysis and financial navigator



Travel/lodging help may be available via nonprofits

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How to Talk With Your Provider

- Share your goals; ask if a trial aligns with them
- Bring NCT (National Clinical Trial) IDs to discuss pros/cons
- Clarify logistics, time on study, and back-up plan
- Ask how and what results will be shared and what follow up looks like

Diversity in Trials: Why It Matters

- Ensures treatments work for everyone
- Reduces disparities; builds trust
- Community sites + language access + flexible designs boost inclusion
- Patient feedback improves access




Underrepresented in Clinical Trials

- Racial/Ethnic Minorities (Blacks, Hispanics, Native Americans)
- Socioeconomically disadvantaged
- Patients in Rural Areas
- Sexual and Gender Minorities (LGBTQ)
- Older patients
- Pediatric patients
- Adolescents and Young Adult (15-39)



Becoming an Advocate

- Join patient advisory/protocol review groups
- Give feedback on consent forms and visit schedules
- Share experiences with advocacy orgs to improve designs
- Help others learn to search and ask about trials
