

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I register for Kesem Together at 2026 Living Beyond Breast Cancer Summit?

Who are the staff at Kesem? Are they trained?

- Our staff are trained National Staff, Volunteer Students and local Kesem Alumni who have worked all year long to plan, fundraise, and conduct outreach in our community for Kesem Together programs.
- All staff members must pass a background check in order to support Kesem Together Programs.

My child has a lot of dietary restrictions or allergies - are you able to accommodate?

- We collect dietary restrictions and allergy information during the program application process. If we are supplying food during programming, we will consult participant dietary resurrection/allergy information and plan the menu accordingly.

Will meals be provided?

- Yes! Kesem Together at LBBC will provide snacks and lunch.

Can my child use their electronic devices during programming?

- Your child may bring a phone with them to programming in case they need to get in touch with you at the start and end of programming. However, your child should refrain from using their phone/tablet throughout programming unless they are trying to get in touch with you.

What if my child has medications they need to take during programming?

- We will not have medical staff on-site during programming. As such, if a child requires medication (prescription, non-prescription, etc.), their parent(s) or guardian(s) must be the ones to administer it. Kesem representatives are not authorized to distribute any form of medication.

What is the age breakdown and differing activities for teens and younger children?

- Kesem programs are a mix of all group and aged-based activities (6-10 and 11-14). Together, the group will participate in team based games such as an obstacle course, a visit to the Independence Seaport Museum, and a reflective craft. Teens can expect to have more activity choices in their separate group time, including competition games, leadership workshops, and more!
