ABOUT KESEM

Kesem is the nation's largest nonprofit that serves children coping with a parent or caregiver's cancer diagnosis. Our mission is to support these children through and beyond their parents' cancer with free, fun-filled creative programs and a lasting community. Today, Kesem operates at more than 120 local chapters across the country, including in the District of Columbia.

Kesem Together programs are designed for children to gather, connect, have fun, and reflect on their experiences with parental cancer while their parents receive support, medical procedures, or cancer treatment. Kesem delivers these tailored programs at conferences, cancer centers, or support groups.

WHAT TO EXPECT

A full day filled with Arts & Crafts, Minute-to-Win-it Games, and themed to include a visit to the Independence Seaport Museum while also providing opportunities for participants to connect with peers who have a parent with cancer. Kesem will have at least 1 staff member for every 5 children in attendance.
